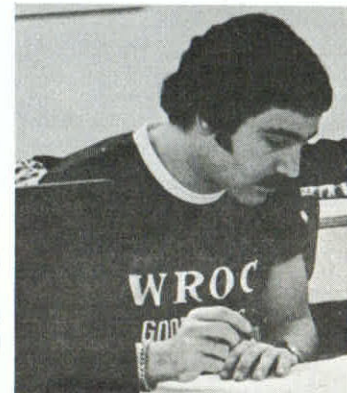

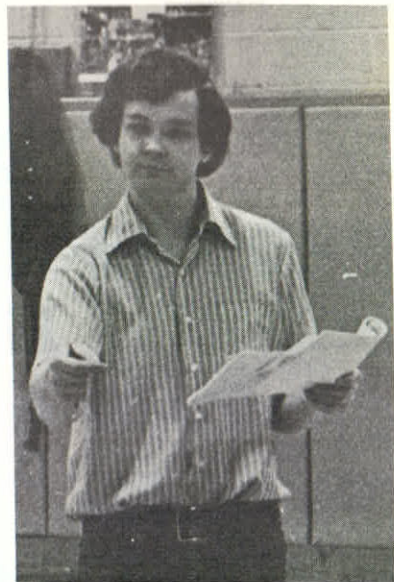
But, as always, the season will be a demanding one requiring sincere dedication by the members and constant support from parents, friends, and boosters. Without this totally united push, we can never realize our goals.

Moorside March

Taking the Squires off the line for an unprecedented third year, the awe-inspiring Moorside has been a favorite among fans and judges alike. With a new introduction comprised of material from the original band score, it remains a powerful and unmistakable testimony to the spirit, drive, dedication and determination that has become the Squires hallmark of success.

Polovetsian Dances from the opera Prince Igor

This year's production consists of a unique musical integration of the brass and percussion sections. The opening in slow meter is the familiar "Strangers in Paradise" actually Polovetsian Dance #1. From there we proceed to Dance #2, last year's production featuring the lead sopranos. Dance #4 follows in the form of percussion solo. A transition to 3/4 time in the percussion ushers in Dance #3. The percussion section is featured again in a solo based on Dance #4 leading into the climax of the production. Now the 'Strangers' theme is heard in the mellophones in cut time accompanied by the sopranos playing Dance #4 in 12/8 time while the baritones have a countermelody from Dance #4 in 4/4 time. This juxtaposition of themes should provide a scintillating emotional climax while exhibiting a considerable degree of musical complexity.

El Morro

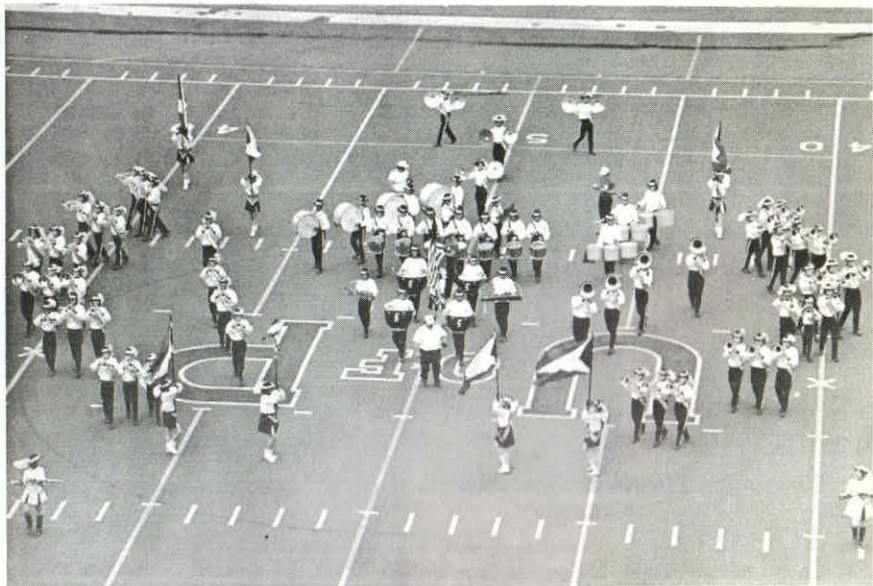
Don Sebesky, who is a well known composer and arranger in the pop music field, features this on his latest album by the same title. His works have also been recorded by Doc Severinsen.

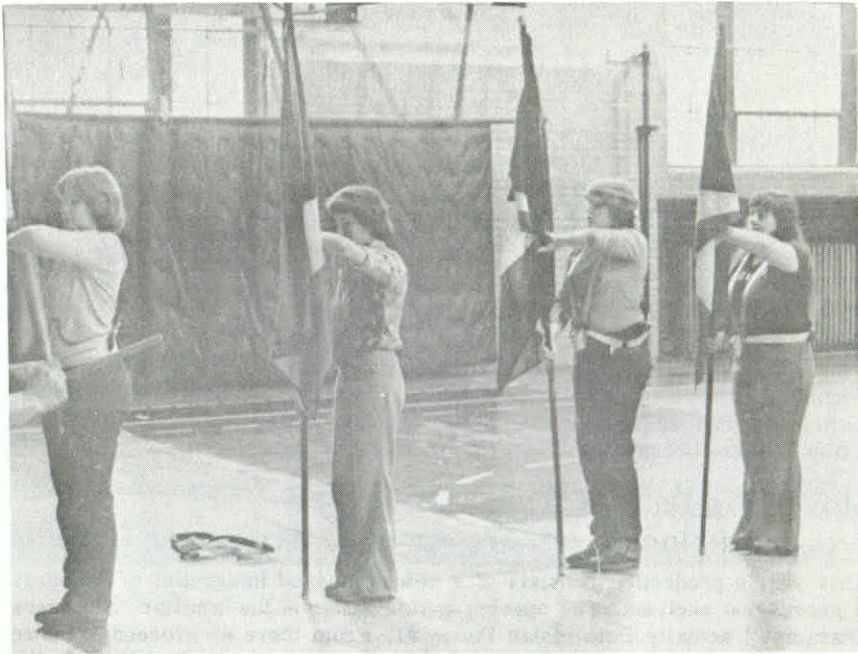
Evergreen

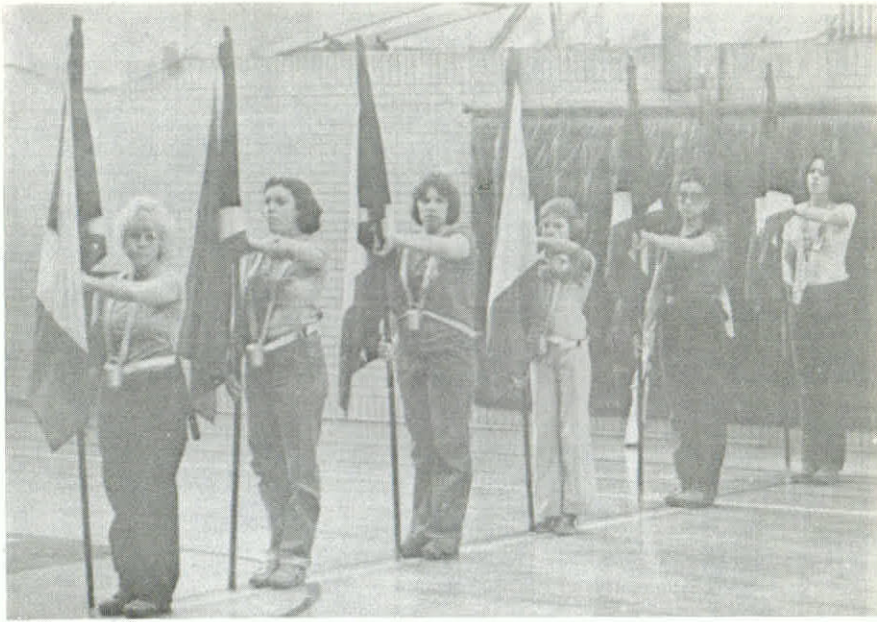

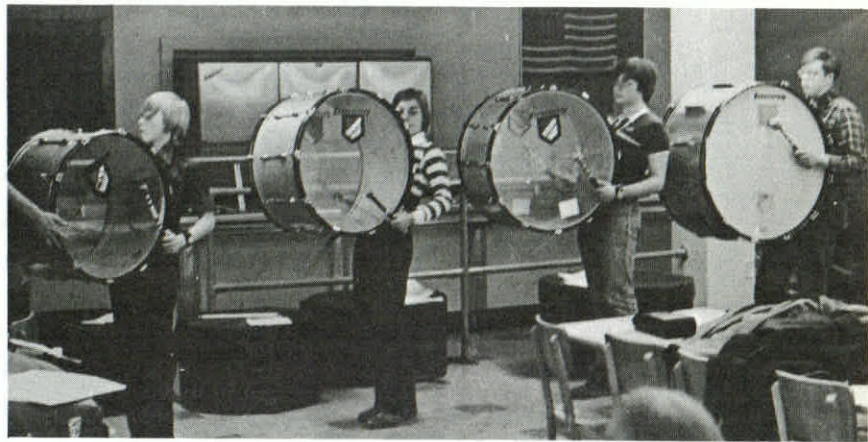

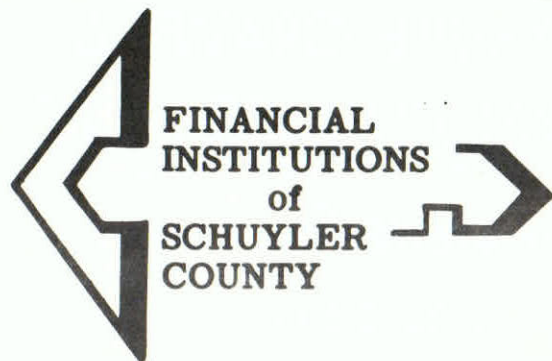

The parents of the "Pages" also recognize and commend the efforts of not only the fine staff of instructors but all who have played a part to assure the continuance of the Corps in the years to come.

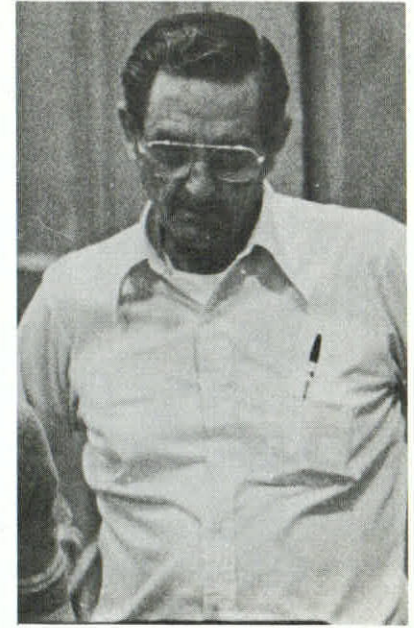
