ALEXANDER'S ENTRY INTO PSKOV Sergei Prokoviev

The film score for "Alexander Nevsky," from which the 1979 opener is drawn, was originally orchestrated for mezzo-soprano, mixed chorus and orchestra. This condensed version of the final portion provides a stirring emotional presentation. Based on the life of Russian folk hero, Grand Duke Alexander (1220-1263), the Entry is the culmination of the tale. The maestoso introduction is the portrayal of Alexander returning to the city of Pskov (pronounced Piz'-kov) after driving invading Teutonic Knights from the Russian homeland. Two other themes, one dance-like and the other more melodic, are introduced by the soprano and baritone sections followed by the mello-phones. The opening presentation is brought to a bombastic climax by the mixing of these themes in a powerful, yet festive setting.

The intense feeling of Prokoviev's personal involvement in this piece is vividly portrayed by the rich harmonic coloring and striking dissonances spread throughout the entire piece. The true magnitude of the Russian people's national sentiment is perhaps most vividly portrayed by this quote from the text of Alexander Nevsky:

Celebrate and sing, native mother Russia!

In our native land foeman shall not live.

Foes shall never see Russian towns and fields:

They who march on Russia shall be put to death!

A percussion solo entitled "Gong" will create the transition from the opening presentation to the production segment of the program. Making maximum use of the plethora of instruments available to the contemporary drum line, this solo is designed as a vehicle for optimum visual support as well as a showcase for the Squires' talented percussion section.

INTRODUCTION

Introduction was first recorded by the rock group Chicago on their first album, C.T.A., originally produced in the late 60's. This version was inspired by a recording produced in 1971 by the Airmen of Note, the U.S. Air Force jazz band. Introduction represents a change of pace in the Squires field presentation. Its length, approximately four and a half minutes, makes it the longest single piece of music ever incorporated into the show. The piece serves as the concert and production portions of the show as it includes a number of stop time segments in its format.

Utilizing many elements of jazz and rock combined, in addition to numerous tempo changes and odd meters, Introduction presents itself as a considerable musical challenge to the horn and percussion sections while offering virtually limitless possibilities for creativity in drill and colorguard design.

EL MORRO

Don Sebesky

As you may remember, El Morro was the Squires' 1977 concert selection. Musically, it will remain basically intact, however, it will be interpreted in a completely different manner from a drill and visual presentation standpoint. The introduction and solo section will be played in a stationary formation, while most of the remaining portions will be played in motion.

El Morro comes from an album released in late 1976. The album was written by Don Sebesky, a well known west coast jazz arranger and composer. Much of his music has been recorded by other artists in the pop music field, such as Doc Severinsen and The Now Generation Brass.

SQUIRES TRIVIA

Since first entering field competition on a regular basis, the Squires have competed in 159 contests and placed first 71 times. In those contests, the Squires placed ahead of 986 corps, while being behind 452 of them.

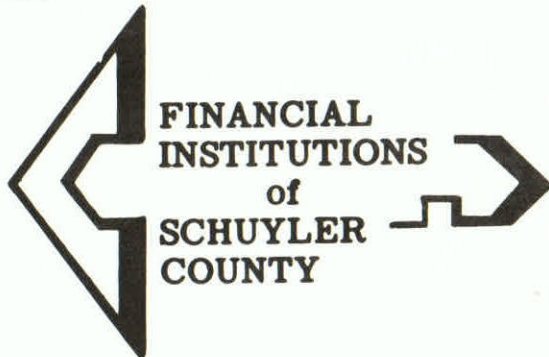

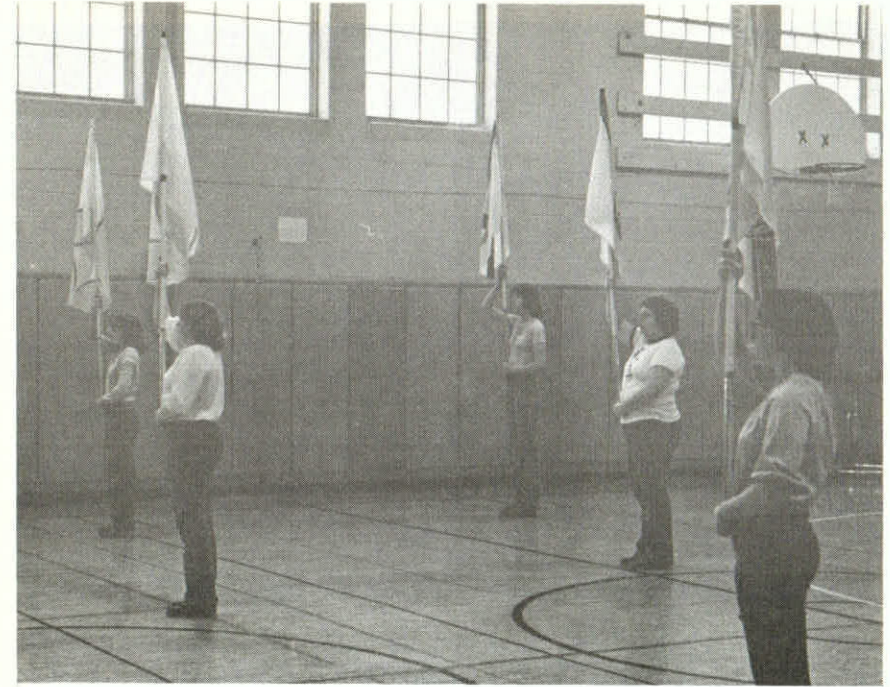

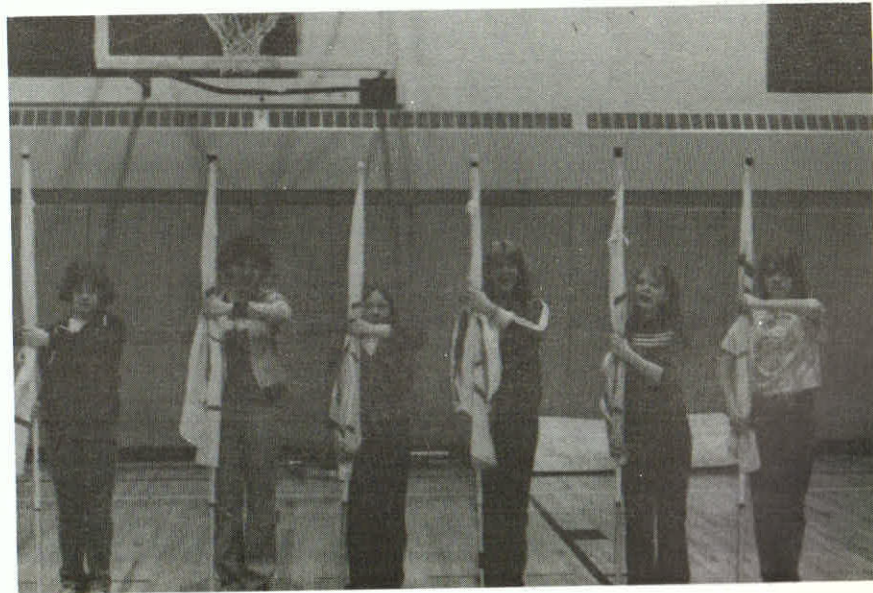
